#### **CONTAGIOUS GENEROSITY**

As I have said on more than one occasion, it is the members of the Detroit Yacht Club that set us apart from any other Yacht Club or marina on the Great Lakes. We have the friendliest people, including our management and staff, and the most giving members around. Our membership is on an incredible roll lately with donations for special projects that benefit our historic club. In fact, the generosity of our members is so strong right now that it's apparently becoming contagious. It seems lately everyone wants to help out in some form or fashion by volunteering, doing physical labor, or providing a gift of funding for a given project. We have members donating monetarily to projects that were never approached or even asked. In several instances, members simply overhead a conversation and offered to help out and participate in some positive way.

As you know, the First Ladies Club, and other interested parties, raised funds to refurbish a portion of the Ladies Locker Room shower area. That initial project has generated more interest and enthusiasm in that specific area of the locker room than anyone ever imagined. In addition to the fact that several members contributed countless labor hours to build the new showers, the scope of the project is rapidly expanding to include the adjacent sitting room and locker area.

First Lady Daryl Dawes and her Com. Ron recently donated a little funding to help move the shower area project along. That initial monetary gift grew to very substantial funding literally overnight. This will be used for carpet, new ceilings and recessed lighting fixtures in an expanded area of the ladies locker room. A portion of that funding went to purchase new metal swinging doors for the main kitchen.

During the March DYC Florida trip member Craig Lamm donated a yacht ride for 50 of our members, which helped raise another \$5,000 to be used in the Ladies Locker room. First Lady Linda Barlow has raised an additional \$3,500 from the women who use the locker room area that is receiving a major face lift. The intent is to purchase brand new replacement lockers in the area by the new showers.



Member Rich Booms, Booms Stone Company, is contributing as well by drastically reducing our granite costs to make these locker room beautification efforts even possible.

Three new granite counter tops have been purchased to date. The first is located in the updated coat check room. The second granite top will go in the sitting area next to the new ladies showers, and the third granite top goes on the new vanity in the adjacent locker area.

The DYC Sea Gulls recently donated all new carpeting throughout the entire front lobby check coat through room, the back office hallways and in to the front ladies locker



room sitting area. The financial gift from the Seagulls was considerable and very appreciated

As we re-build Slab and Midway docks, part of the project scope includes putting in rough plumbing for boat waste pump out systems. It makes sense to do this now while the docks are torn apart. Funding to



complete the pump out system was not available in the dock overhaul project. Member Rob Koueiter raised \$7,200 in an evening from fellow Midway dock residents who gladly funded the completion of the pump out system as well as replacing the old wooden trash containers with modern fiberglass bins.

### More Power Please

Slab dock has had electrical problems for years due to the lack of adequate electrical service being supplied to the boats in addition to modern boats requiring more electricity to power many appliances. An anonymous member just donated well in excess of \$20,000 to cover the purchase and installation of new switch gear and a transformer that will provide more than adequate electrical power to all of the boat wells on Slab dock. Slab dock members also stepped right up and donated ample funds to purchase the remaining wood necessary

to complete the finger piers on their dock and the remaining fittings and hydrants for the pump out system.


Members Mark Abramovich & Jeff McCarty, owners of TAG Computer Group, just donated additional computers and software for the club business offices.

There are many other completed projects that couldn't have been done without members that have contributed in some special way to make them all possible. #### A Brand New 420!

As time passes and our children learn to sail we must find ways to upgrade our tired equipment. DYC Jr. Sailing Chair, Paul Lee teamed with Bob Cowles, Chair of the Sailing Development Fund and paved the way to purchase a brand new 420 sailboat for the program. This new addition to our fleet will help keep our top sailors competitive in the Detroit Regional Yacht-racing Association (DRYA) regattas as well as teach our new sailors the art of double handed sailing. Both Paul and Bob deserve a big pat on the back for the time in pursuing and closing the deal. Now let's put it to good use and go win some races! Hopefully, our kids will bring home the awards to keep the DYC Burgee flying proudly.

#### **Brand New VHF Handheld Radios!**

Now more good news: In keeping 'Safety' at the forefront. We have been able to replace our worn out VHF Handheld radios. West Marine had a deal on last year's model. We had to jump fast and with a Generous Contribution from the DYC Boating Committee they purchased Four Icom M34 Radios. These radios are tough and they float as well. Com. Skip Gmeiner has also donated a New Hard wired mounted VHF to be installed in the Jr. Sailing Skiff Safety boat. Please

thank your Fleet Captain and Boating committee for keeping an eye on our kids and Sailing Program.

The DYC races and teaches the children to sail in three types of boats: the "420" (a two handed boat), the Laser radial and full rig (single handed boat built for speed) and last but not least, the Opti, which is the largest fleet of raced boats in the world, also a single handed boat that is great for both beginners and skilled sailors.

#### How Are We Doing?

With the 6 "winter" months behind us and the 2012 boating season about to get into gear, I'm sure some members are curious as to how we are doing financially.

I'm happy to report that the Club continues to show steady improvement in all areas.

Our membership counts are above budget, we've exceeded our targets for Grill and banquet revenue, and we continue to cut costs. We have proven that we can operate year round - as the only 12-month-a-year Club in the area.



We are adding a number of new boating members this season, and we've set a new record for how early the boats are returning to the harbor. Myself, I had two boats in the water on March 25th!

We are performing much needed replacements of two of our docks, Slab and Midway, and are funding

that project using the Harbor Improvement Fund we established in 2010. Member donations are also being made to upgrade portions of those docks. We even are applying for a federally funded grant under the Clean Water Act to add pump-out capability to

these and other docks. The hard work and expertise of a number of our members is making this happen.

We also continue to monitor the status of our tax exemption application for the Detroit Yacht Club Foundation, and expect that the review of our application will occur this spring. We filed our application in September, and IRS is currently reviewing applications received in July. It's a slow process, but this is a long term strategy to ensure the future stability of the Club. The Foundation board and advisory committee continue to work diligently to develop plans for fundraising and communication in anticipation of being granted our tax exempt status.

As we move forward with a busy schedule of summer events, I'm confident that the Club will continue on its upward path. As always, you can feel free to contact me if you have any questions or suggestions at *gregorynowak1* @*gmail.com*.
